Supplementary Appendix A. Interview Guide

Element Addressed	Question(s)
Personal Narrative	Let's begin with a typical day during the height of the pandemic, detailing the start of your day through the end of your day.
Identity	How did you view yourself, as a healthcare provider for New York City, during this time period? How is this different from how you saw yourself in your healthcare role before that time?
Identity	How has your view of your role as a provider changed since the onset of the pandemic?
Personal Life	How did you view yourself, as a family member/friend, during this time period? Describe any worries or risk of responsibility you felt in potentially transmitting the virus to others.
Moral Injury	Describe some moments in which you felt you were extending yourself beyond your role.
Moral Injury	Describe some moments when you questioned the standards in your role.
Moral Injury	What were the things that you had to do to keep yourself going during this period?
Moral Injury	What was it like to experience threats of rationed care for your patients?
Moral Injury	How did you reconcile what you knew about best practices and good patient care vs. the reality of circumstances?
Moral Injury	How did you view the effect of political leadership (either on a federal/state level or within your institution) on your ability to carry out your job during the pandemic?
